Why You & Your Employees Should Attend This Seminar

Subcontracting is a cruel, harsh and unfair business – it always will be.

Do you understand the risks you are taking on when you are subcontracting, and do you know how to minimize them?

The fallout from the Mainzeal collapse has seen many subcontractors suffer large and potentially crippling losses. It has become apparent that in many cases these losses could have been reduced substantially by a proper understanding of contractual conditions, negotiating appropriate terms, understanding and controlling the risks, and by proper contract administration.

Regrettably many subcontractors just accept the subcontract terms presented by the head contractors as "standard" without fully understanding them and realizing what risks they are really taking on. They go ahead expecting to be paid. It turns out fine most of the time, but construction company failures have always occurred and must be accepted as an on-going reality.


This seminar series will present information on the basics of contract law as it applies to the construction industry in New Zealand.

It provides practical advice on items to be aware of and to negotiate before entering into a subcontract. It will help you understand which are the critical conditions and terms you should be aware of before entering into a binding contract.

Matters covered will include responding to an "acceptance of your tender" that is really just a counter offer, negotiating acceptable terms, understanding the critical items, signing a contract, and ongoing contract administration.

It will explore options for reducing your risk and will include a session on use of SA–2009 to show participants how to use the Specific Conditions to ensure their agreed terms are incorporated. SA–2009 is the current Master Builders Subcontract agreement and was developed with input from subcontractors. All subcontractors should be insisting on its use.

Andrew Hazelton is a Partner in one of New Zealand's premier construction law practices, Hazelton Law. He is a graduate of King's College London with a Master's degree in construction law. He has practised in the field of construction law for over 20 years and appeared as Counsel in many High Court cases, arbitrations and adjudications.
